Request for Proposals

Overview

- ✓ The Kendall Institute facilitates the develops of projects that *support* international social work education projects.

- ✓ These projects:
 1. Help prepare students for global citizenship
 2. Encourage opportunities for international social work.

Request for Proposals (cont.)

Outcomes

- ✓ **Creativity**
- ✓ **Timely**
- ✓ **Transferable**
- ✓ **Sustainable resources**
- ✓ **Completed project deliverables**



Eligibility Criteria

- Open to all CSWE members, including program members in candidacy.
- At least one member of the project team must be a CSWE member.
- Projects may include collaboration with community partners or organizations.

Evaluation & Selection



Content

- Advances the field of International Social Work Education.
- Shows clear evidence of knowledge of the field.

Intentionality

- Clearly identifies the need within international social work.
- Shows strong potential to be transferable and adaptable in multiple college/university settings.
- Plan for dissemination is clear and specific.
- Provides educational benefit to social work education community.

Innovation & Uniqueness

- Well thought out, stands out, and provides a new approach to international social work.
- Provides a distinct and distinguished contribution to the field.

Budget & Finances

- Provides clear and well outlined budget allocations.
- Budget allocation extends beyond travel funding (travel funding is not the primary purpose for the grant).

Sustainability

- Provides clear outcomes that are sustainable after the Kendall Grant Timeline.
- Proposal has strong institutional support.
- Proposal has strong potential to succeed after Kendall Grant Timeline.

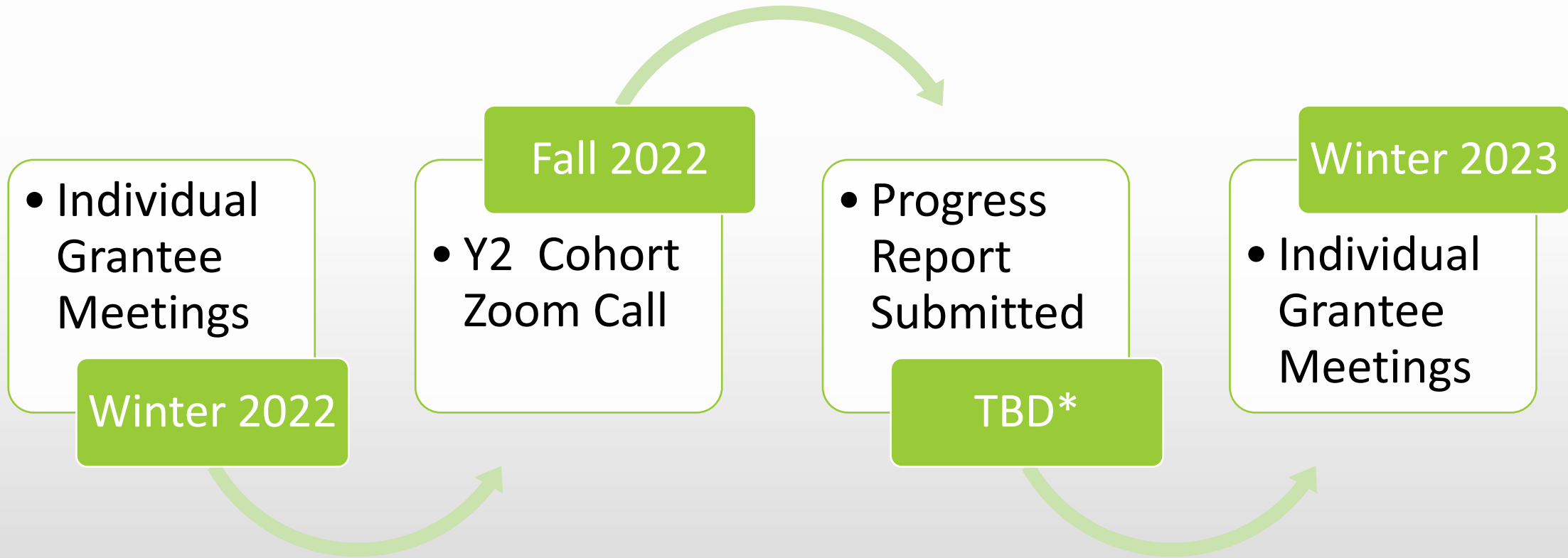

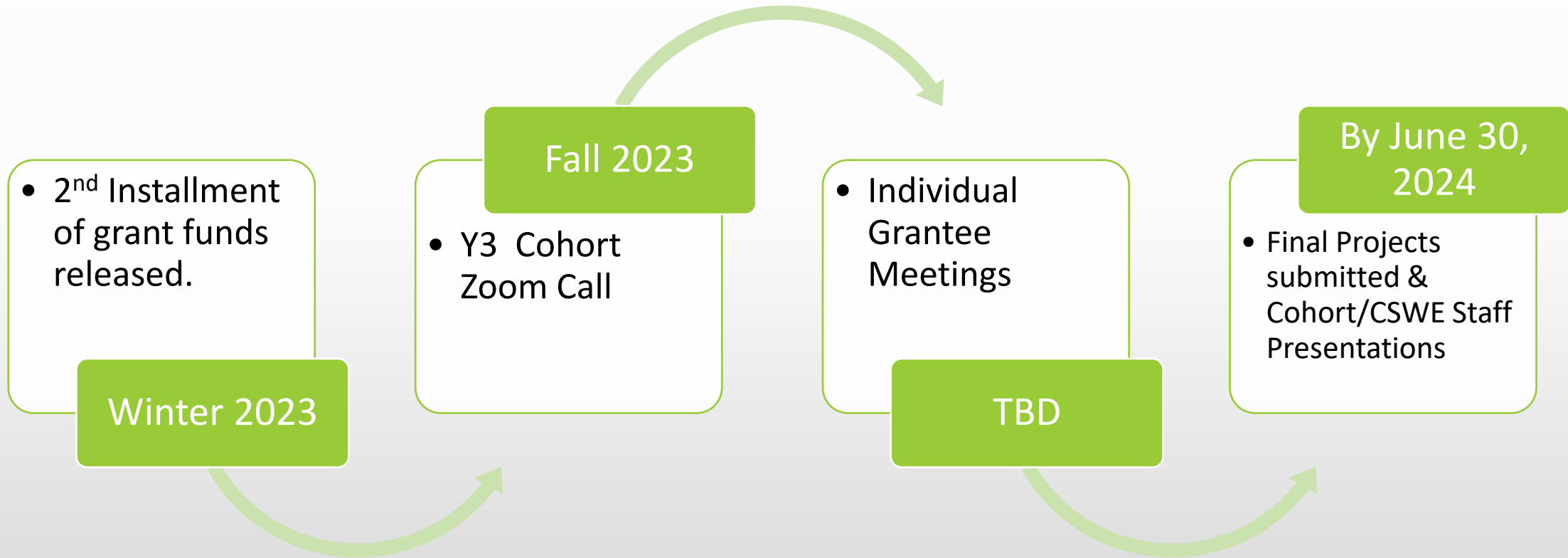
Timeline at Glance

Submission

- E-mail to kendallinstitute@cswe.org

- Format:
 - ✓ PDF
 - ✓ All RFP Components
 - ✓ Times New Roman 12pt. Font
 - ✓ Double Spaced
 - ✓ 1" Margins
 - ✓ Page Numbered (bottom center)
 - ✓ Do not exceed 14 pages
 - ✓ 3 Pages of Addenda

- All clarifying questions on the content of the proposal must be submitted prior to Monday, April 12, 2021, at 5:00 pm EST.

- Submissions are due no later than Friday, April 15th, 2021 at 5:00pm EST.



Proposal Details

- ✓ Project Abstract (500 words max)
- ✓ Statement of Need (500 words max)
- ✓ Project Description (1,000 words max)
- ✓ Goals and Objectives (500 words max)
- ✓ Transferability & Sustainability (500 words max)
- ✓ Timeline (500 words max)
- ✓ Budget (about 1 page)



Important Budget Reminders

- Travel funds: The Kendall Institute will not fund projects for which the primary focus is travel.
- Additional funding sources are allowed. Please include a description of any additional funding or matching sources in this section.
- Explanation is **CRITICAL**. Justify the purpose of each line item.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Does the proposal need to have a partnership with an international university?
 - Not a requirement but past grantees have had partnerships with international universities.
- Is there an initiative in place to update the web resources of your institute?
 - Yes, we are in the middle of strategic planning and updating web resources is something to be done in the future.
- Does the entire project have to be centered around just social work or can it be utilized for other helping professionals in collaboration with social work?
 - Helping professions is a plus, not required.
- Would a curriculum focused on work with refugees, asylees, immigrants (documented and undocumented) in the U.S. qualify for funding through this grant? Or is the purpose to train for practice in settings outside the U.S.?
 - Yes, this is allowed.
- Can this funding be awarded to support international faculty/ student exchanges? Or is it better to focus on internationalizing the US social work curriculum?
 - Yes, but it should not be over 15% of the overall budget.
- Is there an opportunity to collaborate with NGOs or non-profit organizations?
 - Community Partners are welcome.
- If the pandemic continues, what is the backup plan?
 - If any changes are made to the original proposal due to deliberate or unforeseen circumstances, the program associate must be informed immediately to determine whether the new scope of work is approved for the remainder of the grant.
