Standard Benchmark Report: 2009 Annual Survey

Prepared by the Office of Social Work Education and Research

Method

The Annual Survey of Social Work Programs (Annual Survey) is a census of accredited social work programs that has been conducted by the Council on Social Work Education since 1952. Data collected in the Annual Survey are the primary source of information about social work students, graduates, and faculty. In addition to advancing knowledge about social work education, the data are also used to determine program membership dues for accredited baccalaureate and master's programs.

The 2009 Annual Survey was broken into five sections, which covered baccalaureate programs, master's programs, doctoral programs, full-time faculty, and part-time faculty. The program instruments included sections on program structure, enrollments, concentrations and field placements (BSW and MSW only), financial aid, and degrees awarded. The full-time faculty instrument collected demographic information along with information about faculty title, role, and time assigned to programs and tasks. The part-time instrument collected aggregate data about part-time faculty gender, age, and ethic/racial identification.

The surveys were administered online through the survey platform Zarca Interactive. In the fall of 2009, survey invitations were e-mailed to program directors at all accredited social work programs and to doctoral programs that are members of the Group for the Advancement of Doctoral Education.

The response rates to the different sections of the survey were again quite high in 2009. The master's programs had the highest response rate with 98.5%.

Faculty

In 2009, 408 social work programs provided information about 3,963 full-time faculty members. "Full-time" refers to faculty who spent 50% or more of full-time employment (FTE) in social work education. In 2009, 311 programs provided information on 4,182 part-time faculty or instructional staff. "Part-time" refers to faculty or instructional staff who spent less than 50% of FTE in social work education.

When reporting demographic distributions by gender, the number of respondents in the category of Unknown Gender is omitted from computation. When reporting demographic distributions by age group, the total number of respondents is used, including those respondents in the category of Unknown Age. When reporting "ethnic minority" respondents, the categories of African American/Other Black, Chicano/Mexican American, Puerto Rican, Other Latino/Hispanic, American Indian/Native American, Asian American/Other Asian, Pacific Islander, and Other are used.

The proportion of full-time faculty identifying with underrepresented ethnic/racial groups was 27.5%. The proportion of part-time faculty identifying with underrepresented ethnic/racial groups was 19.5%.
