

CSWE and its <u>Board of Accreditation (BOA)</u> piloted the accreditation of practice doctorate programs from 2021-2025. It is anticipated that additional practice doctorate programs will be able <u>to seek accreditation in late-2025</u>. This timeline is subject to change pending Council on Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) review and expansion of the BOA's accreditation scope. CSWE's BOA is currently <u>recognized</u> by the Council on Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) to accredit baccalaureate and master's social work degree programs in the United States and its territories.

Programs interested in seeking accreditation are encouraged to complete the <u>Practice Doctorate Program Record Audit Form</u>. This will allow CSWE to maintain accurate records to communicate important updates as they become available



Memo to the Social Work Profession Regarding Practice Doctorate Program Accreditation

March 31, 2025

Dear social work colleagues, clients, constituents, and public interests,

In social work education, the Council on Social Work Education's (CSWE) Board of Accreditation (BOA) is <u>recognized</u> by the Council on Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) to accredit baccalaureate and master's social work degree programs in the United States and its territories. Since its inception in July 1952 (and its predecessor since 1919), CSWE has accredited master's programs. In 1974, CSWE began accrediting baccalaureate programs.

In recent years, the number of practice doctorate programs has grown from 5 in 2014 to 38 in 2024, and continues to grow according to a recent audit of social work programs conducted by CSWE. In response to questions regarding how practice doctorate degrees align within the social work education continuum, CSWE partnered with social work programs, social work educators and leaders, doctoral students, health accreditors, and other constituents to conduct an environmental scan, gather data and feedback, and create pilot accreditation standards prior to launching the accreditation pilot. prior to launching the accreditation pilot.



 Accreditation documents tell your program's story as guided by accreditation standards



Writing Style & Formatting

- Write succinctly and clearly
- Ensure accurate and complete at time of submission
- BOA cannot make any assumptions
- Ease the process for the reader
- Review and use policy 4.7, Document Formatting & Submission Requirements in the <u>Accreditation Policy</u> <u>Handbook</u>

Writing Style & Formatting

- Use subheadings!
 - Subheadings Are Fun
 - Our Team Agrees
 - Consider Bolding and Italicizing
- For each benchmark and self-study:
 - Volume 1 (required template)
 - Volume 2
 - Volume 3
 - No appendices

Writing Style & Formatting

- Do not embedded documents
- Not visit websites

Writing to an Accreditation Standard

- Stay grounded in the purpose of the standard
- Write to each element/component of the standard
- Many citations result from missing or unclear content
- Explicitly address each program option in response to each standard
- Program-specific (e.g., practice doctorate program)
 rather than institution- or department-specific

Template & Form Use

- Do <u>not</u> alter the forms
- Fill in program information, including within footer
- Delete the gray highlighted and that text which instructions identify
- When site another volume, include page number reference
